

Minors Requirements Using Italy Study Abroad Courses

It is desirable that 18 hours become an integrated package. Students are expected to work with the School advisor for minors (Rebecca Liao) to obtain approval of courses taken prior to enrollment. Courses taken Pass/Fail will not count towards the 18 credit hour requirement.

It is the student's responsibly to complete the form "Petition for Certifying a Second Major or Minor" and obtain required signatures from Rebecca Liao in Hulbert Hall 103K. This will result in the School receiving a copy of the student's paperwork. Upon completion of all minor requirements, the School will then notify the Registrar's Office that all requirements have been met.

A student may **minor in economics** by completing 18 hours of economics, nine of which must be the 300-400 level, with an overall GPA of at least 2.0 in the required courses. You must have completed 60 hours and have a cumulative GPA of 2.0.

A student may **minor in sustainable development** by completing 18 hours in the course work listed above. The student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 in the required course work and take have the course work at a 300-400 level. You must have completed 60 hours.

At least four of the courses, including at least two upper division courses, must carry grades and grade points from WSU. Deviations from the state requirements must be approved by the Associate Dean of the CAHNRS.

Econ 198 is listed for Honor students.

****Only three hours of Econ 496, 497, or 499 may be used to fulfill either of these requirements.**

A total of 6 hours of transfer work may be counted toward a minor requirement for courses at the 100 or 200 levels only. All other course work must be taken at WSU.
