Requirements: To be eligible to certify in an economics minor, students must have a cumulative 2.0 GPA. A minor in economics requires 18 hours of ECONS courses, nine of which must be at the 300-400-level with an overall 2.0 GPA in the required courses and taken in residence at WSU or through WSU-approved education abroad/exchange courses.

No course for the Econ minor may be taken on a pass/fail basis.

A total of 6 hours transfer work may be counted toward the minor requirements for courses at the 100 or 200 level only. Only 3 hours of 497 or 499 may be counted as upper division electives.
